





MORTAL KOMBAT

Violent arcade game attacks the big screen!

Mortal Kombat is probably one of the most violent arcade games ever made. Considering the game features decapitations, impalings and other grisly deaths, I was somewhat queasy at the thought of it morphing into a big screen extravaganza with killer special effects and big budget to be even more grisly. However, when the movie teasers began, it was exactly that which made me interested: The special effects looked awesome. I was still somewhat leery of the violence that I knew would be there, but I decided to grab an airline barfbag and brave it.

The plot revolves around a fight that occurs once in every generation. People from all over the world gather to see who's the best combatant among them. The movie opens with the introduction of our heroes, Liu Kang (Robin Shou), Johnny Cage (Linden Ashby), and Sonya Blade (Bridgette Wilson). They end up aboard a spooky ghost ship right out of ancient Chinese folklore. Here they discover that the Mortal Kombat isn't just among humans; it spans across other dimensions as well. Should any particular dimension win ten consecutive combats, the ruler of that dimension will rule over all dimensions.

The evil sorcerer and ruler of the desolate Outworld dimension is Shang Tsung (Cary-Hiroyuki Tagawa). He has a powerful fourarmed adversary who has won nine victories for Tsung. Earth, however, has Christopher Lambert as its mighty Thunder God Raiden to guide and protect it. Raiden does his best to instruct his three champions to victory.



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They have an ally in the beautiful princess Kitana (Talisa Soto), who was once the ruler of Outworld before Tsung took over. However, Raiden's champions must overcome personal challenges before they can win in Mortal Kombat.

Thankfully the movie is not as violent as the arcade game. There are plenty of fight scenes (and I majorly understate that) with plenty of injuries and deaths accented with appropriate bone crunching sound effects. If you're squeamish about such things, don't see this movie. On the plus side, the really violent actions are either not shown directly or aren't even done, like decapitations. However, this is a movie about mortal combat, so appropriately, you have to have fighting. Since I'm not a karate/fighting movie type of person, I grew bored with it very quickly.

The reason I went to see this movie was the special effects, which were very nice. Another good aspect is the character development. Granted, it may be a little lopsided leaning toward one specific trait if each character, but at least it prevents the characters from being completely one-dimensional. Also, they use humor wonderfully to lighten up the mood. Raiden has some vicious oneliners as does Cage, though he is more stereotypically slapstick humorous. Also, if you like dance/techno music, you'll love the soundtrack. I haven't wanted to move my body like that in a long time.

Obviously, comparison must be made between Lambert's Raiden character and his Conner McCloud *Highlander* character



since both are immortals. Actually, I even overheard someone describe *Mortal Kombat* as a karate version of *Highlander*. This would be an good comparison, though maybe not fair. After all, "there can be only one" *Highlander*. (::waits for you to stop groaning in agony:: Yes, I've been waiting to pull that one.)

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Ruth Thompson's work appears on Magic Ice Age cards, *Dungeon* magazine, and more.

Adrian Washburn was born February 4, 1951, and has lived in Birmingham, AL since three. "Like most kids growing up I've watched more than my share of science-fiction movies and television shows. The earliest movie I remember was *Battle in Outer Space* when I was in the third grade. The earliest book I read was *The Time Machine* for a 7th grade book report.

"I discovered fandom as a result of a fanzine review called "The Club House" in the August 1973 issue of *Amazing*. I requested a fanzine [called] *Huityloxyptl* #8 by Meade and Penny Frierson. Meade wrote back and mentioned that he ran out of the zine but gave me a copy of *The Southern Fandom Confederation Bulletin*. I bought a membership to the SFC (\$1.00 a year at that time) and in 1975 a local *Star Trek* club run by Steve Ashley was able to discover my existence and invited me to join... My first convention was Kubla Khan 3 in 1975."

Rick Shelley grew up in Kankakee, Illinois with an early interest in science-fiction since he realized that a Shelley had written Frankenstein. "The 50's were a great decade for sf movies (mostly of the paranoid variety). And there was a television show, even before *The Twilight Zone*, that captured— and held— my attention. That was *Science Fiction Theater*, with Truman Bradley... Once I learned to read, I also read all of the science fiction I could get my hands on." After serving in the army for three years after high school, Shelly worked at various jobs. Although he started writing fiction in high school, it wasn't until the early 80's that he started writing seriously. After a brief period of unemployment, Shelly made his first sale in January 1984.


The books Shelly has written are the Varayan Memoir fantasy series (*Son of the Hero, The Hero of Varay, The Hero King*), the Seven Towers fantasy *series* (*The Wizard at Mecq, The Wizard at Home, When the Bell Was Rung*), the Lucky 13th military science fiction series (*Until Relieved, Side Show, Jump Pay*), and *The Buchanan Campaign*. He has also had several works published in *Analog, Space & Time, Unique, Aboriginal, SF Review,* and *Science Fiction Age*.

Roland Castle says he was a "science fiction fan from birth but a TRUE science fiction fan since the first time [he] attended Con*Stellation... I opened up a hole-in-the-wall shop to raise the money and found out that there was a demand for such shops. Working at comic conventions helped supplement the shop's income." Deciding to host his own convention, he enlisted the help of Sunn Hayward to start Magnum Opus Con.
