COMMANDING OFFICER

Accepting our current status and looking forward.

OK, I must have been in a bad mood when I wrote that last report. It was extremely pessimistic and I apologize for that. However, the underlying ideas are still valid though. We do need to increase our membership and our participation level. However, a few things have happened recently to give me a much brighter outlook for our future.

First up was the Fifth Anniversary Celebration. This proved to me that good participation in a *von Braun* event is possible. With 22 people in attendance, half of which were our own members, it was a fabulous success. You can get the lowdown on what happened in the next issue. Now if only we can continue to have such well attended fun events.

Second is the STARFLEET Operations web site, which contains the number of crewmembers taken from the Monthly Status Reports. While there are a handful of ships with over 30 members, I'd say about half have members numbering in the twenties and about half have numbers in the teens. In comparison, most of the Region 2 chapters are in their teens. However, the chapter I'd love to emulate, the USS Hephaestus in Birmingham, has 25. Therefore, statistically speaking, we're not that different from other chapters near us.

Third is an article I received from Howard Cronson (STARFLEET's Internal Auditor) of the USS Christa McAuiffe. He provides his own analysis of why two major Boston area organizations (one independent club and one STARFLEET chapter) have suffered from severe membership loss over the past few years. He blames this member attrition on three major influences: 1) Demographic changes in the membership: People grow up and get busy with families and other real world obligations. 2) The "mainstreaming" of Star Trek: After all, it use to have a cult following, but now over 50% of Americans consider themselves "fans." 3) The abundance of information on the internet: People no longer need to join a club for information they can now get for free in the comfort of their own home.

All I can say is that he is absolutely right. His explanations

sound so simple, yet explain so much. I finally stopped blaming myself for actions that I have no control over. For the first time in a long time, I'm feeling very optimistic about the *von Braun*. Of course, now the question is how do we overcome these problems?

We can't control the lives of our members who get busy with real life problems. However, we can work to insure that those new members who do come in are able to do the things they would like. This may mean changing our schedule to the most convenient time for everyone to get together. Furthermore, we may have to take extra care in cultivating officer qualities in those who might not normally consider themselves an officer or Department Chief.



We can't really combat the mainstreaming of *Star Trek*. This double edged sword is both good and bad. It may allow for more of what we like, but at the same time people may become over-saturated and lose interest. If people no longer have to join a club to chat with like minded individuals, why should they? Therefore, we need to think of something to offer people that they can't get anywhere else. I thought showing Voyager episodes would be a big draw to our meetings since most people can't see it in Huntsville. But so far, it hasn't worked. Any other ideas?

Nor can we combat the growing internet juggernaut. Simply shifting our focus to the internet would radically change who and what we are. Furthermore, not everyone has net access and I don't want to leave them behind. However, the personal interaction that a club offers can't totally be replaced by the internet, so perhaps that is where we need to focus. There is something to be said for being able to go see a movie with a bunch of friends or watching the latest episode at someone's house.

Anyway, I've stopped feeling guilty and personally responsible for the decline in members and other problems the ship faces. Though I still accept the responsibilities for the things that I can control. The success of the *von Braun* also rests in your contributions as individuals.


Astronomical highlights for upcoming quarter:

October:

Jupiter will be visible in the east-southeast sky to the naked eye just after dusk on October 3 and 4. Saturn will be in opposition to the Sun and also closer the Earth presenting a bright appearance also in the east southeast sky with complete opposition occurring on October 23. The two planets will be in conjunction toward the end of the month.

November:

Jupiter will continue to be the brightest point of light in the sky nearing a conjunction with the Moon on the evening of November 27 in the southeast part of the sky. Saturn will also



December:

Jupiter and Saturn will continue to be good sights this month with Jupiter appearing in the southern night sky and Saturn in the southeast part of the night sky. Saturn will have yet another visit from the Moon near the end of the month on December 27. Venus will reappear after the beginning of the month in the lower part of the southwest horizon shortly after sunset.

COMMUNICATIONS

Crossing the content barrier.

Sorry for the extreme lateness yet again. I know you're tired of the excuses, and I'm tired of always having to make them. This time various delays occurred with my Las Angeles vacation to attend Voice of the Resistance, I decided not to make this the special fifth anniversary issue simply to remain on schedule with the cover date. Therefore, the issue with the Fall 1998 cover date will be the special issue. Therefore, if you want to have your submission included, I should have it immediately. If you never submit anything again, at least submit something for this special issue.

Lately, the issue of mature content in a fan publication has came up more frequently. I'd thought I'd take a moment to share my opinions on that with you, and go from there. Unfortunately, there is no absolute rule that I use. It really varies with the intent of the content. Let me elaborate.

Overall, I'd say this newsletter garners a G rating, if you use the U.S. movie ratings system. However, sometimes it does earn a PG rating due to more mature content. I don't think it would ever receive a more mature rating than that. Since this is a print medium, most of the more mature material comes in the form of "four letter words," and less often in images.

For example, in the last issue, I let some rather heated commentary, including a four letter word slang, appear in a departmental report. It didn't even occur to me that it was somewhat racy till someone else pointed it out to me, even though this person was not upset about it either. However, it was a valid point.

Even I have said and printed some "colorful metaphors" during meetings and in my writings. They even have in our favorite television show as well. I think everyone has. So where do you draw the line between freedom of speech and going overboard with stuff that's inappropriate for children? There's no easy answer, but I'll try.

First, there's the frequency such words are used. If every other word, or even sentence, contains vulgar slang, I feel that's overdoing it. However, once or twice a report is about as far as I would dare push it or allow it. This corresponds to the occasional "dirty" word in our shows.

Second is the intent of the words being used. If someone is using profanity simply for the sake of the words themselves, then that is too much. However, slang slipped in once in a great while for major emphasis is OK. After all, you're probably well aware how a simple word such a "cute" can be both derogatory and complimentary depending on who uses it, the situation they're in, and who or what they're referring to.



The third consideration is the intended audience. After all, if only adults will be seeing your content, you can be more mature. (Though some would say that being crass is immature, but that's a whole different argument.) Our newsletter audience and crew is mostly young adults. However, we do have a handful of minors (under 18) and older adults. Keep that in mind as well, since you wouldn't want to speak down to the adults or over the kids level of understanding.

Fourth is the use of euphemisms, which is the use of "nicer" words in place of "naughty" words. I just don't understand why people can get away with some words, but not others, just because they sound less vulgar even though they mean or refer to the exact same thing. Related to this is the use of character symbols (*!#\$&^, etc.) to replace letters in the offending words, or even the entire word itself. Unfortunately, this social convention will probably never change.

Now let's turn our attention to visual media. All of the above considerations also apply to pictures. However, visual input has a few more twists and turns to it. Live, in-person events will shock you more than a movie, which is in turn will shock you more than a few snapshots from the event. Even color can be somewhat more dramatic than black and white depending on the subject. Of course, this is a generalization and may not be true in all cases. Even taking the exact same images and turning it into a cartoon or drawing will lesson the impact.

So what is too mature for a newsletter? Again, that varies with the intent of the contents. Remember a few meetings back when I displayed the cover of a newsletter? While the drawing itself was nicely done, the general feeling was that it was too racy for the type of publication that it was on the cover of. It didn't mesh well with the intended audience and tone of the internal information.

Science-fiction imagery in general can be rather provocative on its own right; the fantasy genre even more so. If you've ever strolled through an art show at a convention, you realize that most male artists seem to draw their heroines in the most scant outfits available. Japanese animation often takes



this to the extreme. Some anime can be downright pornographic and violent in nature. Even American cartoons are pushing the boundaries lately with shows like *South Park* and *Spawn*.

Adult imagery is nothing new. Comics have always been notoriously sexual in their character portrayal. Heroes often wear nothing more than bathing suits or loin clothes for costumes like Wonder Woman and Hercules. Even if they are wearing a full body suit, ample cleavage and curvature on the women and bulging muscles on the men can be easily seen under the physically impossible outfits. Not that I'm complaining, mind you, but I am pointing out that most comic artwork has a tendency to be very sexual.

By now, you're probably wondering if I'm just on one of my rambling rants or if this actually relates to your newsletter. It does in a round about way. For example, a crewmember goes to a convention and later submits pictures and an article for the newsletter. Anyone who has been to a convention knows that fans just love to dress up as their favorite characters. As a result, it may be too racy for the newsletter.

What do I consider safe to include? Again, it varies with the intent of the contents with relation to our audience. Basically, if I can show it to my mother without embarrassment, it's safe to put in the newsletter. (By the way, she's a very loving and devoted born again southern Baptist. Of course, I would be willing to show others in more compromising situations than of me. ::grin::)

In the final wind up, I don't think I've ever published anything in this newsletter that has severely offended someone. Granted, it may have embarrassed a few, but I don't think I've crossed the barrier and been too adult oriented. If I have, I apologize. Always feel free to offer constructive criticism on the newsletter. If you don't like the content, please tell me what you would rather see. While I can't guarantee you that I will change the newsletter, I will at least listen to your requests objectively and fairly.

MEDICAL

Requesting a medical kit.

As Chief Medical
Officer of the USS Wernher von
Braun, a United States Naval
Medical Officer, and a trained
emergency technician, I feel
that it would be in the best
interests of the ship and her
crew to have on board a medical
kit for emergency purposes.

This kit would contain all of the basic emergency medical equipment needed for an medical emergency treatment. That equipment is listed as follows: Stethoscope (already provided), sterile latex gloves, gauze (pads and roll), medical and surgical scissors, medical tape, blood pressure kit, pen light (already provided), bandages, anti-diarrhea medication, burn aides and creams, ipecac (anti-nausea medication), splints, towels, blankets, fire extinguisher, various sweets (for diabetic emergencies), burn spray, disinfectant cream and spray, anti-septic wipes, aciticyllic aspirin (Tylenol, Bayer, Advil), cold packs, heat packs, bottles of water, and a flashlight with a backup set of batteries.

I know this all seems overwhelming and expensive. It is expensive but I may be able to pull off a deal with some of the hospital's medical suppliers. This kit is extremely necessary. We at the hospital have been faced with countless number of preventable injuries and emergencies, all of which could have

been avoided if the people admitted had they had a proper or well equipped emergency first-aid kit at their location.

This is not something that I am asking for me, but it is something that I am asking for myself, the hospital, the ship and her crew, and possibly fewer trips to the ER. With the ever increasing effects of the seasons and the weather and its accompanying temperatures, it is vital that all persons be well equipped to handle all emergencies.

I am also going to ask if anyone is interested in taking a first-aid emergency care course for knowledge of how to react in times of emergency. I am also suggesting this because of my upcoming departure from the ship itself. I do not know when that departure will be, but I would feel a lot better knowing that she and her crew are well cared for and provided for in my absence.

I feel very strongly about this as this matter of concern does fall in with my responsibilities as ship's doctor. I am not asking for an immediate go ahead, just for a thinking over and discussion with fellow officers and crew. As far as supplies for the emergency care kit go, could it be possible to ask that the ship's members pitch in what they can towards the purchase of such materials or that we as a ship come up with an alternate plan.

Thank you for taking time out of your busy schedule to consider my request.




- 6) An enigmatic being composed of pure energy attempts to interface to the *Enterprise*'s computer, only to find out that it has forgotten to bring the right leads.

Further syndication, books and PC games, and new stuff.

Hello again Fleet fans, it's time once again for our peek into the Universe of *Trek* Goodies and see what's out there.

We're going to start off with the bookworms. As you may remember, in my last column, I mentioned that Mike and Denise Okuda were working on another revision to the *Trek Encyclopedia*. It appears that this statement may have been premature. After consulting the *Trek* book web site, at www.simonsays.com, one of the Pocket Book officials informed me, via return e-mail, that this statement was only rumor which was not based on any facts.

I have sent an e-mail message to the Trek trade paperback editor to find out if this work was indeed in progress. As of this writing, I have not received any response but I will continue to look into this matter and inform you readers of any new developments. I want to say that I will not write on any books unless I have confirmation that any are in the works, or will be in the works. This way, I can hopefully avoid raising any false hopes.

The DS9 Technical Manual is still set for release around October 1998, and we will get to see this work come to pass.

Also out in the bookstores is the *Captain's Table* series, which now comprises four books covering Captains Kirk, Sulu, Picard, Sisko, and Janeway. Two more books will be released, later this year, which will cover Captain Calhoun, of the *New Frontier* series, and Captain Christopher Pike, of "The Cage" and "The Menagerie."

Q will contribute to the book arena with a book series entitled *The Q Continuum*. Look for these books in the fall of this year.

Jeri Taylor, who is leaving *Voyager* after this season, has penned a hardcover *Voyager* novel entitled *Pathways*. This work covers the life stories of the *Voyager* main crew. An audio version is planned for simultaneous release with the book. Look for this work any day now.



For you fans who have been following DS9 during the Dominion War, a set of four novels is planned for release around the November time frame. Most of these novels will be adaptations of key DS9 war episodes.

Voyager crewmember Seven of Nine will have her life story covered in an upcoming VGR novel of the same name. Christie Golden writes this work.

For the web surfers in our audience, The *Star Trek* Continuum is now up and functional at www.startrek.com. IBM is the main sponsor of this site, which has undergone some big changes since it was let go from The Microsoft Network.

I encourage all of my readers, with Internet access, to sign on and check out this site. This is the OFFICIAL site sanctioned by Paramount Pictures, and there are some great graphics. A neat feature is the Surround Video features of the various sites on the Continuum. Web surfers who use Netscape 3, or higher, can get a free download of the Surround Video plug-in.

The only exception is that Microprose has canceled work on the *First Contact* PC game in order to focus its attention on its upcoming *Trek* strategy and Klingon games. You find out the latest



Your bedroom starts looking like Downbelow.


