Programming will start at 6 p.m. Friday. FCAPT Richard L. Trulson The numbers game in our various departments.

As much as I hate to start off on a somber note, I must. Our STARFLEET numbers have dropped to the lowest they've ever been. In fact, we're below the ten minimum needed to maintain our status in STARFLEET. If we don't get new members soon, the USS *Wernher von Braun* will be decommissioned in a few months. However, it's not too late to prevent this from happening.

First, if you've let your membership lapse, please renew. Most people seem to only be a part of STARFLEET for a year, then drop off. I'm not sure why this is. Second, if you are about to join or renew, please consider adding a family member or roommate onto your membership. If you are current, thank-you very much.

Third, get friends involved and get them to join. Word of mouth has always been the best and cheapest method of recruiting, whether it's through coworkers or classmates. Fourth, suggest some recruiting activities or help with those we do have. For example, carry around some of our business cards to give to prospective people. Or help by placing flyers or brochures where science-fiction fans may be, like comic shops or book stores.

Granted, I realize sometimes that you simply can not afford to join. I know how it is to stretch every last penny out of a meager paycheck. Even though it may hurt us, never neglect your real world needs simply to join us or STARFLEET. Even though we charge local dues to produce the newsletter, if it comes between Fleet and the ship, always pay your Fleet dues first. Additionally, contact me for payment assistance, as we may be able to work out a barter of some sort.

For the past several years, our numbers hovered in the teens. While that met the minimum requirements, that's no where near the thirty or more members we had when we commissioned as a starship in September of 1993. Of course, there are many reasons for our decline in membership, which I covered in the last issue. Even if we do get the ten minimum, I'd like to have at least twice as much, which seems to be the level that the best chapters maintain. At that level, there's a number of people actually in the various departments instead of a single person serving as both the department and as a Department Chief. It also prevents the people involved from stressing out as much as they are better able to distribute the work load responsibilities among the members.

Speaking of Department Chiefs (DC), we have several positions open. This is a great opportunity for the people who joined back around the Voyager day to get involved. Each DC is responsible for planning activities related to their department. You also serve as a link between the average member and the Commanding Officer in case they feel uncomfortable coming to me directly about something. And ideally, you should report monthly in our newsletter, though no one is going to beat you if you don't. You must also be a member of STARFLEET. Let me go over what each department does so you may have a better idea of what you'll be responsible for.

Command Department consists primarily of the CO and XO of the ship. And by our by-laws, you can only hold those positions if elected to them. However, other members of the Command department assist the entire Command Staff in various ways. Good organizational and leadership skills are suggested.

Communications Department is responsible for all ship's printed materials (newsletters, flyers, awards, etc.). Skills needed include graphic design, newsletter layout, desktop publishing, and the ability to work with continual deadlines. While there is someone doing this currently (me), I really wish someone else would take this time-consuming responsibility off me so I can concentrate on running the ship as a whole.



Engineering Department builds props and other items (parade floats, displays, etc.) for the ship; therefore, electronic and construction skills would be helpful. Even a good craft maker or other hobby enthusiast would work.

Medical Department DC should have actual medical skills and resources. While we hope never to require their services, it would be nice to have someone who at least knows CPR at our functions. The DC may also help organize recruiting or fund-raising events.

Operations Department is the general catch-all department. They organize and run all ship's events (fun activities, community service projects, fund-raisers, etc.) and keep the ship's money and financial records, in conjunction with the Command Department. They, along with Communications, would maintain the ship's web page. Good organizational, planning, financial, accounting, and business skills are needed.

Science Department is currently headed by LT(sg) Don Daniel. Sciences is responsible for informing the crew of science, astronomy, and technology news. They can also help plan our educational or community service programs.

Security Department assists members at ship functions and maintains order during meetings. They may also plan fun activities and programs. This use to be a largest and most active department.

We use to have several other departments as well. However, they were eventually absorbed into other Departments as our numbers shrunk. History, Finances, and Computer Operations were combined into Operations due to their similar functions. The Marines disbanded and were absorbed into Security.

So as you can see, we need a DC in every department but Sciences. If you're interested, or need more information, please let me know. Of course, everyone has a hand in making the ship successful, whether you're a DC or not. Everyone is welcome to make suggestions for what the ship should do, and to help with and attend those functions.





For the book worms: a two volume TNG series is now in the stores. The title is *Gemworld* authored by John Vornholt. This is a world of pure crystal and will provide a challenge for Picard and the crew of the *Enterprise*-E.

While thumbing through the latest edition of the *Communicator* magazine, I happened to look at Quark's Bazaar and happened to see an interesting item. For the baseball fans in the crowd, Quark's is now offering the Official DS9 Baseball Team Cap. This cap is the exact same style as was worn by the DS9 team in the famous baseball episode. (So sorry, but I can't remember the title at the moment). Don't strike out! Get yours today at Quark's, via the *Communicator* magazine. Price is \$15.00.

On the PC front, the CD-ROM edition of the *Trek Encyclopedia*, is now in the book stores. This is being offered in a single package along with the regular book version. This is at least a \$60.00 value for only \$45.00. This is complete through all of the seasons of the *Trek* series to date and the *Insurrection* movie.

On a little side note: WHDF-TV, Channel 15, of Florence, Alabama is the new UPN station for North Alabama and South Central Tennessee. Viewers with cable in this area should contact their local cable operator to find out if and when WHDF will be on their system. If your local cable system does not get it, get you and your fellow *Trek* fans to swamp their office with requests. That should get their attention since you are paying customers.

TREK CHECKS

FCAPT Richard L. Trulson Checking out the final frontier.

When *Star Trek* 30 came to Huntsville in 1996, one of the freebies in our package was a check sample from the Anthony Grandio company. They offered a thirtieth anniversary edition that featured gorgeous pictures from the *Trek* series. I didn't purchase any checks then since I didn't need any at the time. However, when I did finally run out of my current supply, I was disappointed to learn that the checks were for a limited time only and had been discontinued.

Then recently on a trip to Russ' house, he showed me his new checks. They featured eight different gorgeous full color designs of the ships from the various *Star Trek* series. This includes all six USS *Enterprise* versions, USS *Voyager*, and a *Defiant/Deep Space Nine/* wormhole combination. The name and address were printed in *The Next Generation* Crillee font style and "Star Trek: The Ships of Starfleet Command" is printed in gold foil. On the back is the schematic drawing of the featured ship.

When I called the next day (1-800-472-6346), the sales rep took my name and address. Just over a week later, I received their brochures in the mail. I was also given their web address (http://www.anthonygrandio.com/) so I could check their merchandise out on the internet. They can also be reached by postal mail at:

The Anthony Grandio Company PO Box 23098 Jacksonville, FL 32241-3098 In addition to the ship series, they have two other check series featuring gorgeous, full-color portraits of many characters from the original *Star Trek* (5 scenes, including the UFP seal) and *The Next Generation* (8 scenes). They also have a single image United Federation of Planets seal check series. A box of 200 one-part standard checks costs \$14.95, or \$54.80 for 4 boxes. A box of 150 duplicate checks are \$16.95 each, or \$63.80 for 4 boxes. The ship series is slightly extra per box at \$19.95 for 200 one-part standard checks and \$21.95 for 150 duplicate checks.

The classic *Trek* and the UFP logo series can have an optional classic Command, Science, Engineering logo added to the signature line for a small fee. The TNG series can have the original combadge design on the signature line. While the Crillee lettering is included with the ship series, they charge a bit extra on the other designs.

They also include a nice vinyl checkbook cover, which has a full color image of the USS *Enterprise* appropriate to the series you order. They're available for \$4.95 each separately as well. As if that wasn't nice enough, they also offer for \$6.95 each a marbled "space" vinyl cover featuring the USS *Voyager* or *Deep Space Nine*. But for the ultimate in luxurious checkbook covers, they over a full grain black leather cover featuring the UFP seal. This \$29.95 luxury offers you credit card slots, picture sleeves, a pen holder, and a photo window.




A collector's set from the Anthony Grandio Company web site.

If you don't have a checking account, or are looking for an unique artsy-type gift, they offer a collector's set for \$139.95. Each set includes one of the first 100 boxes ever produced (nonnegotiable for payment purposes), four matching numbered and signed uncut sheets of check stock suitable for framing, the checkbook cover originally sold with the series, and a signed certificate of authenticity. They currently offer just the Ships of Starfleet and the Thirtieth Anniversary collector's sets, and I imagine the former is almost sold out.

Finally, they also offer *Star Trek* return address mailing labels as well. They over two designs, one vertically oriented and the other more horizontally oriented. They have four full-color designs featuring the original and TNG *Enterprise*, *Voyager*, and *Deep Space Nine*. Since many people can produce their own mailing labels on their inkjet printers, people may find it hard to justify the \$9.95 price tag.

At least now I know where to go when I'm ready for new checks. The Anthony Grandio Company also offers a *Xena: Warrior Princess, Wizard of Oz,* and Florida wildlife check series.

The Rocky Horror Picture Show, "As The Fishnets Run," is done by Richard Obrien with a Charlotte, NC based "Rocky Horror Cast." They perform a pre-show and a modern version of this sci-fi classic. The cast consists of local college students, actors, and experienced "Rocky Horror" performers and fans. And of course, they encourage full audience participation.

All reservations at the History Village Inn and Conference Center, the host hotel, must be made through Magnum Opus Con. Arrangements with all other hotels can be made with the hotel themselves. However, the host hotel is already booked. Therefore, these other hotels must be used: Holiday Inn (706-549-4433), Courtyard Marriot (706-369-7000), and Travelodge (706-549-5400).

You must become a member in order to attend MOC XV. Also if you are under the age of 18 you must be accompanied by a parent or guardian, as older friends are not acceptable. Membership is \$40 until March 10 and \$45 after that. Payment is by check, money order, or credit card. No cash accepted, unless you pay in person.
